Milkweed Refuges in Non-crop Areas

Farms are full of non-crop areas that can be put to use to

increase biodiversity. By planting milkweed and other nectar plants in non-crop Milkweed and nectar plants around garden edges invite areas of farms, farmers can support biodiversity and monarchs to the farmstead. a flourishing monarch butterfly population alongside high-production agriculture. Grassy areas between grain bins or next to tractor sheds make great patches for butterfly gardens. Unproductive portions of fields can encroachment into a clean field. Milkweed and nectar plants can replace plants that already grow alongside alleyways, roadsides or in ditches. Milkweed and nectar plants can trace through brushy or wooded areas.
